**Family Studies:** (minimum 12 hours) FAM 252; choose three from EDP 202<sup>-</sup>, EDP 203<sup>-</sup>, FAM 253, FAM 254/PSY223, FAM 255 (\*for those interested in a teaching career)

**Geography:** (minimum 12 hours) GEO 130; GEO 172; *GEO 152* or *GEO 160*; any 200-level geography course

**History:** (minimum 15 hours) HIS 104; HIS 105; HIS 108; HIS 109; one 200-level history course

**Journalism:** (minimum 12 hours) JOU 101, JOU 204; choose an additional six hours from COM 249, PS 101, PS 235
