Will my GPA from BCTC be averaged with my new GPA at UK?

No, your GPA will be used for admissions purposes only and will not be factored into your UK GPA.

Are there a limited number of credit hours that can be transferred?

There is a limit of 67 transferable hours from any two-year institution. An advisor will work with the student to determine the appropriate credits to be used for degree completion.

How many credit hours must I complete at your institution to earn a bachelor's degree?

Transfer applicants should note that regardless of the number of transfer hours the University may accept, all candidates for a bachelor's degree must complete 30 of the last 36 hours of their program at UK.

Is there a foreign language requirement to receive a bachelor's degree?

This will depend on the student's major. For students who complete an AA or AAS degree at BCTC and their transcript is GETA certified, UK will waive the University Studies Program (USP) Foreign language requirement. If the student has completed two full years of the same foreign language in high school, the USP requirement will be waived as well. Some majors require additional foreign language courses.
