How Do I Find an Article?

Most of our journal and magazines articles are available through our library databases. You can search our online library databases and find full-text journal or magazine articles that you can print out, email to yourself, or read onscreen.

To find our online databases, go to our "Find an Article" web page at:

Click on a link to the database you want (For example, "Academic Search Premier") and then do a search (for more details on specific databases, see guides for several of our databases at the Library's "How Do I?" web page)

Quick Tips for databases:

- Click "Full Text" box on initial search screen if you want only full-text articles to appear; click "Peer-Reviewed" box if you want only peer-reviewed, academic articles to appear (find these options under "Advanced Search" in some databases)
- Enter your keyword(s) and click search; if you don't get any results, check spelling of your keywords (Keyword = a word that a user believes is relevant to the information sought)
- 3) In the results list, click on "PDF Full Text" or "HTML Full Text" link to view an article

Looking for a specific journal or magazine title, but don't know which database to start with? Try the E-Journal Portal. The E-Journal Portal allows you to search by journal name, and lists which database has the title you are looking for. Find the E-Journal Portal on the "Find an Article" page of the library website: http://www.bluegrass.kctcs.edu/Library/Articles.aspx

We also have several journal and magazine titles available at the library in paper format. To find the locations of those titles, use the KCTCS Library catalog and do a "Journal Title" search. Then, you can find the journals or magazines on the shelves at the library or learning commons, or ask a librarian for help.
