




## Newspapers

Full-text content of many national and regional newspapers. Major newspapers include the *New York Times*, *Wall Street Journal*, *Chicago Tribune*, *Washington Post*, *USA Today*, *Los Angeles Times*, and the *Boston Globe*. Regional newspapers include Louisville's *Courier-Journal*.

<p>1) Go to the BCTC LRC homepage at <a href="http://www.bluegrass.kctcs.edu/en/Library/Articles.aspx">http://www.bluegrass.kctcs.edu/en/Library/Articles.aspx</a> . You can narrow your results by clicking on various limiters located in the right hand column of your search results page. Click on the *plus box*  next to an option to expand it.

For example, you could expand the “Publication title” limiter, and then limit to articles from one source, such as the *Wall Street Journal* or the *Washington Post*, by clicking the name of the source.

#### 5. Read, print, email, cite, export, or save
